Scouts are also encouraged to ask the school's science teacher for a clearer

explanation. As a scout who learns first aid, you must be able to name the body structure and system. This is because we have to take good care of the body to avoid injury. There are some rules that every scout must follow in case of an accident. While acting must do so carefully and in a state of calm. There are four main steps to think and do immediately, to face the situation, to determine what happens to the victim, to provide immediate treatment and to arrange where the victim should be taken to either the doctor, the hospital, the clinic or the home. This depends on the injury suffered by the victim.

First aid equipment should be stored in a special box or box. Ideally the first aid box should always be taken everywhere. This box should be taken during a scout meeting or while attending a camping. This box should be provided in full to meet any possibility. However, this box should not be too large. The appropriate size for an emergency box is 30 cm x 12 cm x 12 cm. If this emergency box is for your own use, use the simple box as it is in the market today. An emergency aid box should be placed in the appropriate place. Record emergency telephone numbers such as doctor's phone number, hospital or clinic for convenience. Among the first aid equipment to be provided are gauze, rolled bandages, triangular bandages, adhesion bandages and regular attached bandages, antiseptics, antiseptic cream, fever remedies, wind oils, appropriate medicines to help launch the excretion, eye cleaning fluid, balsam or swab medicine for headgear and muscle cramping, needle and chopsticks, appropriate pin pins for refinement of a bandage or bandage, knife or scissors that can cut cloth, rolled bandage, cloth and so on.
